

How to Follow Regulatory activities

The programs adopted by the California Energy Commission (CEC), the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), and the California Air Resources Board (CARB) have a tremendous impact how whether Californians have clean energy sources. CPUC

The CPUC is a quasi-judicial agency - and it uses legal jargon to describe its activities. To *officially* participate in a CPUC proceeding participants must file to become an "intervenor." There are specific rules and formats for intervenors to file comments and to participate in a proceeding. Most intervenors require a lawyer's service to effectively participate in a proceeding, and in some cases intervenors who represent the public interest can be reimbursed by the CPUC for their expenses.

Anyone who wants to follow a proceeding but not become an official intervenor can request to join a "service list" for the proceeding. Requests to join the service list may be emailed to the Process Office at process_office@cpuc.ca.gov This e-mail address is being protected from spam bots, you need JavaScript enabled to view it . Include the proceeding number, and all of your contact information in the email. Once on the service list you should receive all relevant emails and decisions related to that proceeding.

The public has 30 days to comment on proposed decisions before they are formally adopted. After the main comment period intervenors have seven days to submit reply comments, before a final proposed decision is made.
